HUGH BAIRD COLLEGE INSIGHT DAY

The day began with a presentation about Balfour Beatty, introducing the various roles within our company, and then we focused on the local schemes we are currently working on. After the presentation, the students participated in a hands-on activity where they acted as the planning team for a construction company tasked with building a new school. Their challenge was to develop a programme of works, ensuring all the tasks were completed in the right sequence and within the 47-week construction schedule.

It was fantastic to see the students collaborate so effectively, using their problem-solving skills to develop their plans. The activity provided a valuable insight into the skillset of potential future work placement students across the Sefton schemes, and it was encouraging to witness their enthusiasm and teamwork. This experience will undoubtedly be beneficial for their development as they move forward in their careers.

As part of the Sefton Maritime Corridor scheme, we are offering T Level students from the Construction and the Built Environment course the opportunity to carry out their 45 week work placement with us. Their course covers three key areas: Design, Onsite Construction, and Engineering. These topics align perfectly with the Civil Engineering roles we offer, making this work placement opportunity a great fit for students looking to build a future career in the industry.

HILLSIDE HIGH SCHOOL MOCK **INTERVIEWS**

Hillside high School organized mock interviews for their Year 10 students, providing them with an excellent opportunity to practice interview skills in preparation for their upcoming GCSEs, university applications, and apprenticeships. The event aimed to enhance the students' confidence and equip them with valuable experience.

We had the privilege of attending and conducting 10 interviews with the students, all of whom were impressively prepared. After each interview, we provided constructive feedback, helping the students identify areas for improvement. We look forward to participating in more events like this one to further support young people in developing their skills and boosting their confidence.

The team from Les Transformations de Southport recently hosted a public drop-in session, inviting local residents and business owners to ask any questions they had about the LTDS scheme. Several local business owners attended to inquire about how the works might impact their operations. We reassured them that we are committed to supporting their businesses throughout the construction phase. Additionally, we explained that the works are designed to enhance the area and attract more visitors, benefitting their businesses in the long run. To further support them we've offered to promote their businesses on our construction fencing, ensuring that people know where to find them during the works. SOUTHPORT MARKET ENGAGEMENT

As Southport Market is one of our key stakeholders, we have worked closely with them to address their needs and concerns. For example, Denise Ryder - market manager raised concerns that the construction work visible from the windows could discourage customers from visiting. In response, we've arranged for the installation of a dot adhesive film to go on the windows that will block the construction view whilst still allowing natural light to enter. The film will feature a design that visualises the completed project, offering a glimpse of the future development.

Additionally, we've installed a digital totem inside the market to provide both customers and local residents with more information about our scheme. This totem also serves an easy point of contact for anyone wishing to reach out to us directly.


We look forward to carrying out more local engagement as the schemes progress into construction and we hope that our business has had an impact on the community of Sefton so far.
